

INTERGENERATIONAL CULTURE: THE POWER OF MEMORY



Our free arts programs were designed for children 8-12, a highly impressionable & vulnerable age group (the age targeted by gang recruiters, drug dealers and other evil doers.) Nonetheless, we never turned away a child, teen or elder. We welcomed whole families. Here is Christina Castillo, (left) a Spanish speaking 3 year old with perfect pitch and an ear for music. We gave her a free private lesson each week. ***We were deeply moved hearing the dreams and hopes of young teenaged caretakers, who came to our program bringing their creative and gifted siblings The teens stayed, joining our circle and inspiring us with their youth and determination to succeed against all odds. Mass commercial culture seeks to turn the generations against each other. Our Native American way is to show respect for everyone in the community: elders and children as well as those shining in the full power of their youth!

Raising money for art education

Proceeds from sales that evening will benefit Foundation for New American, an organization founded by Legere that provides free music and art classes to low-income children in New York City's public schools, and at a summer camp in the Lehigh Valley.

"We hosted a summer camp for many years at South Mountain Farm in Emmaus," she said. "And we will be doing it again at this year."

Legere, who was part of the 1980s New York underground art scene, counts Larry Rivers, Allen Ginsberg, Peter Beard, Joni Mitchell, Hunter Thompson and Bowie as former collaborators.

But nowadays, she is more focused on educating youth.



"After the financial crisis in 2008, New York City eliminated art and music lessons for 80 percent of the school children. I felt like it was a tragedy," she said.

In 2022, Foundations for New American was awarded a National Endowment for the Arts Grant for its work, and this year got a New York Department of Cultural Affairs grant in support of "Paint Brushes Not Guns: Multimedia and the Power of Cultural Memory," a free program for artists 8 to 12 years old.

Most recently, Legere and four other teachers organized an arts and music program at a public school in Queens, New York.

Legere wanted the foundation's hiring process to foster diversity.



"Two of the teachers were Indigenous, one was a person of color and the other teacher was a member of the LGBTQ community," she said.

Paying tribute to her Native American heritage

Legere's newest work is centered heavily around Native American themes and imagery, drawing a parallel between racial inequalities and how the planet is "misused by man."

As a descendant of the Abenaki tribe, she believes there is a connection between the mistreatment of Indigenous people and climate change.

"You might [ask], 'What do missing and murdered Native Americans have in common with endangered rivers, streams and oceans?" she said.



We have a profound responsibility: to nurture the visionary artists of tomorrow. Some come to us having witnessed terrible scenes of torture and death. Some have been carried over the Rio Grande and taken from the heart of their ancient and spiritually robust culture.

The Yaqui Tribe, split between Arizona and Mexico, say that every soul is flower.





We gave each child a Diario D'Oro - a Golden Notebook in which to write their deepest hopes, dreams and fears. We said "Your heart is safe with us."





Our staff come from the populations we serve. We are 95% BIPOC. All of us experienced oppression. We are racial, gender, econmic, ethnic, immigrant outsiders. Add to this the fact that true creativity is not respected, nurtured or encouraged in 85% of NYC public schools. We taught with the full realization that artists walk a rough road of rejection, ostracization and very often, abject poverty - but true artists have no choice but to obey their muse.

Here at the Foundation for New American Art we love our fellow artists of every age. it was an honor to serve creative children and their families through our Paint Brushes Not Guns program in 2022 - 2023.

We taught solid drawing & paintng skills, music theory, performance techniques as well as digital recording & digital art & video.

We developed a new way to teach art, music, movement, and story. For children who have no arts in their schools our program changed lives. Even with our tiny budget, using a plano that is little more than a toy, we were able to spark joy and uninhibited self expression in children from vulnerable communities. We welcomed mothers, fathers, siblings and grandparents to be a part of our participatory, community, teaching artistry. We taught respect for self, respect for diversity, respect for the environment, for health, for elders & for women. We used ancient indigenous and tribal wisdom to heal our community. We were honored to served visionary young artists and we equiped them with knowledge of all the arts. We helped prepare them technically, and psychologically for their entrance into the art and music world through audition & portfolio prep.



Great artists stand on the shoulders of the artists who came before them. We taught art history in a way that children could understand. We painted it in fresh paint, quickly and then invited tchildren to add their own stories to the great timeline of visual art history.
